

Upperclass and Transfer Application Procedures

The *CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE Application* and the *Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)* serve as the official applications for need-based financial aid at the University of Notre Dame. To be considered for financial assistance (scholarships, grants, loans, work) students must annually file both the FAFSA and PROFILE applications by the University's priority filing deadline.

Application Deadlines for 2009/2010 Academic Year	
<i>Priority processing and aid consideration are given to those students who meet the following deadlines:</i>	
2/28/2009	CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE due to the College Board
2/28/2009	Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) due to the Department of Education Central Processor

NOTE: Although families are encouraged to use actual tax information when completing the PROFILE Application and FAFSA, estimated figures may be used, if necessary.

Step One

Step Three

If requested, submit supporting documentation to the Office of Financial Aid

Note: To be eligible for federal student aid a student must be a citizen or eligible non-citizen of the United States with a valid social security number. In general, students must be degree seeking and be enrolled on at least a half-time basis. Additionally, students may not owe a refund on a federal student grant, nor be in default on a federal student loan.

Financial Aid recipients also must meet minimum Standards of Academic Progress in order to qualify for assistance. The Standards of Progress are outlined in detail in the [Bulletin of Information](#).

Students who withdraw from the University during a semester are subject to the University's [Withdrawal Policy](#) which may result in an adjustment to University charges and/or financial aid credits.
